 - Lighting: Bearded Dragons are COLD BLOODED creatures which means that they require a Heat bulb. You must also have a UVB bulb (Artificial Sun), to allow the to get nutrients the would normally get from the sun. At night, if your home reaches a temperature below 60*F, you will need to have a black light or a ceramic heat emitter.
 - Food: Bearded Dragons Eat many different types of greens such as Collard or Turnip Greens. They also require a live food source such as Superworms or Crickets. I feed my

- two bearded dragons a mixture of turnip greens, collard greens, and mustard greens, with the occasional grape. For live food, I feed them superworms and crickets.
- Habitat: Bearded Dragons are usually housed alone, because of the amount of size each lizard requires. A few essential things that you must have for your Beardie home are........... 1. A place for them to hide.
 - 2. A basking spot.
 - 3. A feeding dish.

The most important thing to remember when setting up a Beardie home is this: NO LOOSE SUBSTRATE!!!!!!!!! This is a huge mistake that many people make, they assume that since they are desert dwellers, the live on sand. Loose substrates actually cause major impactions and many deaths! I would recommend Paper towels or tile, these cannot be very easily into your dragon unlike sand or nut shells.

• Hazards and Illnesses: Bearded dragons are for the most part very hardy creatures, but not indestructible. Always have your eye on them so they don't get into trouble. Just like humans, bearded dragons can get illnesses too, the most common illness is called Metabolic Bone Disease or MBD for short. This disease is truly horrifying to Bearded dragon owners, it comes from the lack of UVB exposure. Their bones will start to deform and they become very fragile, Eventually, if the disease is not properly cared for, the dragon will die.
